Manner Mimes

Game 1: What do they do and how?

Each card shows the name of a person on one side and the manner in which he or she does something on the other side.

Play in groups of about five. Deal out the cards with the names on top.

Look at your own cards and make sure you know what the verbs and adverbs mean and how to pronounce them. Ask your teacher for help if necessary.

Start: The youngest player takes a card and introduces the person on it.

For example: His name is Steve Wilson and he

The player then mimes the action “skis well” and the others have to guess what Steve Wilson does and how he does it. The initials of the name provide a clue!

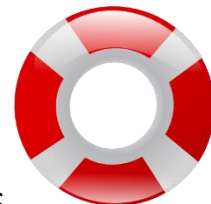
It is important to mime only, don't speak or make any noises!
