Look at the following 'ingredients' of your stories and decide how they influence you as a reader:

**Introduction/Beginning**: How does the story start? How does the author get your attention?

**Ending:** Does the ending come as a surprise or were you expecting this ending? How does the author create the surprise?

**Language:** Does your story use any words or phrases that you think are very important or interesting. What do you notice about the style of the story? Are the sentences long or short? Choose a few good expressions or words that you want to include in one of your own stories.
